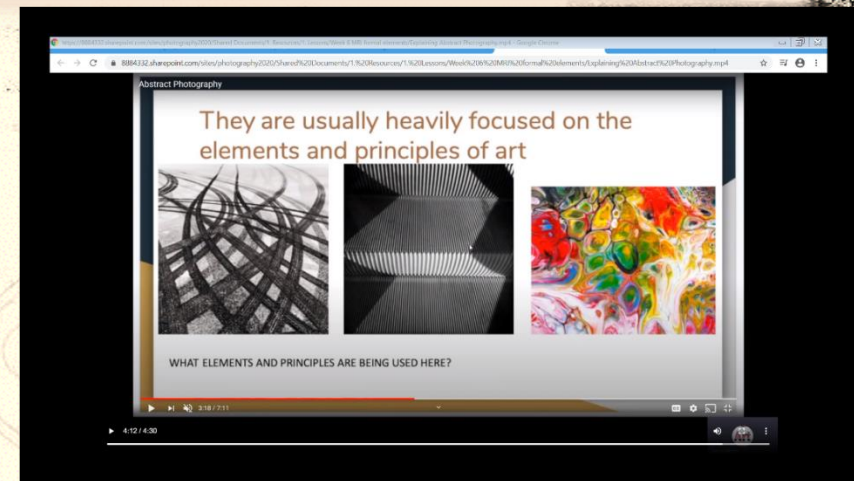



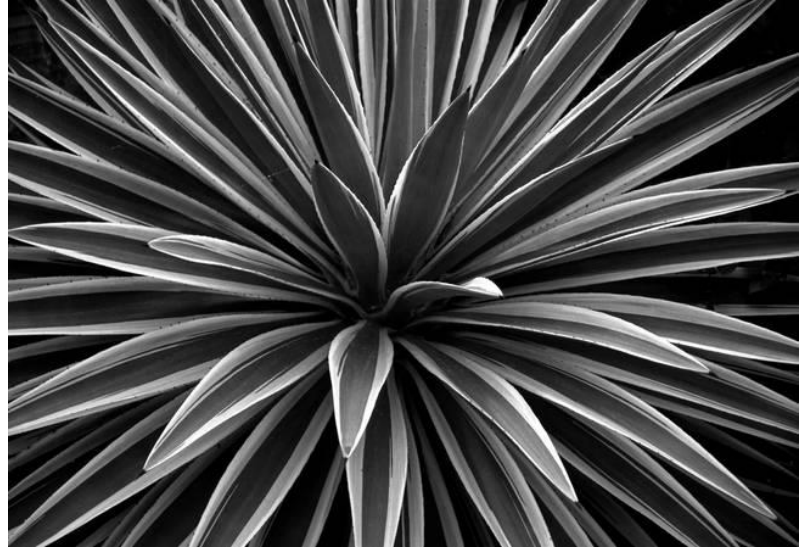

- ✓ Set your Aperture to its lowest setting (you can always adjust on shoot)

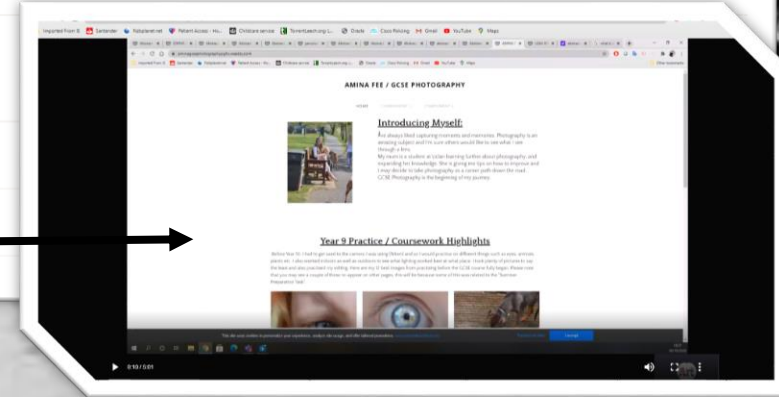
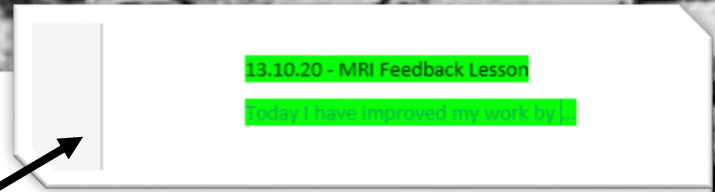
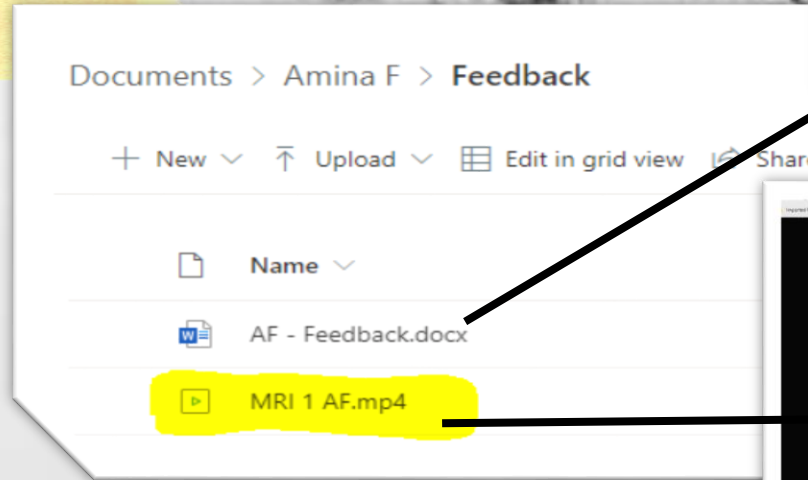

INVESTIGATION OF ELEMENTS / PHOTOGRAPHY SHOOT (Line/Pattern/Tone)



For your homework task:

3. Explain what you did on your Shoot ...

- What equipment did you use? (DSLR / Kit lens / Prime / Macro / Black & white / Monochrome setting / what was your aperture setting f/1.8 to f/9. **TOP TIP** - if you display images on your camera, it will tell you what the Aperture, Shutter Speed and ISO setting were. This is handy for planning further shoots.
- What were the environmental conditions? (weather / lighting) did that affect your shoot - consider ISO
- What vantage points did you use (Cloe up/ Arial / Worms Eye / Ground level)
- What did you learn/gain from the experience? (benefits of using black and white / abstract qualities / shooting outside)
